# PLEASE NOTE

ALL dairy cattle, beef cattle, and swine must be identified by an official USDA radio frequency identification (RFID) ear tag, commonly referred as an '840 RFID tag.'

# SHOW ATTIRE

Exhibitors clothing should be neat and clean and appropriate for task at hand. Whites are strongly encouraged! Exhibitors must present a neat and professional appearance in showmanship and conformation classes. Farm names and letters must not appear on clothing. No sandals, open-toed shoes, tank tops, midriff or cropped shirts or shorts allowed.

# **CATTLE REGULATIONS**

- 1. County and New York State Fair animal entry form deadline is JULY 27. No late entries will be accepted after the July 27 deadline per the 4-H Program Issue Committee. Scratches can be made at any time.
- 2. All 4-H dairy cattle must be in place by 5 pm Monday and remain until 8 pm Saturday.
- 3. All dairy cattle exhibited in this department must be governed by the same health and general rules and regulations as listed for the open classes.
- 4. Dairy cattle must be owned and registered, as well as cared for by the exhibitor, since June 15 of the current 4-H year.

# 5. Dual Ownership (NEW RULE)

Dual ownership between siblings will be allowed as long as all of the following criteria are met:

- a. They are bona fide siblings (sister, brother, step-sister/brother, half-sister/brother, adopted).
- b. All siblings on registration paper of animals are of 4-H age and regular members as of January 1<sup>st</sup> of the current year. Cloverbuds are not eligible. For New York State Fair: entries entered through FFA or endorsed by a breed organization representative will need to follow 4-H rules on age also for the Dairy Youth Show.
- c. One sibling has to designate the animal as their project animal for the project year by June 15 of the current year by filing and completing animal identification form.

- d. Completed animal identification forms needs to be filed with appropriate organization (4-H Extension, FFA or Breed Organization) to state youth designation by June 15. A copy of this form also needs to accompany State Fair Dairy Youth Entry form being mailed to Dairy Youth Superintendent along with the other required documents stated on entry form.
- e. Designation cannot change during the program year and animal must be shown and exhibited by designated sibling.
- f. Bred and owned recognition can be given to designated youth as long as dual ownership is a current and legal partnership filed with breed organization.

# 6. Non-Ownership Project Animals

Exhibitors who have filed a Non-ownership Certificate with Cornell Cooperative Extension, Hamden prior to June 15 of the current year are eligible to show. Exceptions to the above rule will be dealt with by the 4-H Dairy Advisory Committee.

Youth are allowed two non-owned dairy animals of which both can be shown at the county and state fair if they have met all the qualifications.

Non-ownership is not available to youth already owning registered dairy cattle. Youth can either own or lease animals of the same specie but not both. For example, a youth cannot own a Jersey and then lease a Holstein.

Dual designation of animals is not permitted.

- 7. All ownership and health papers must be available for inspection all week.
- 8. No pending registration papers or pending transfers allowed.
- 9. Registration papers will be checked by a member of the 4-H Dairy Advisory Committee on Monday of fair. Animals not having the required registration papers will be disqualified.
- 10. Official identification (RFID tags, tattoos) that matches the registration must be visible and unaltered. Two forms of identification are encouraged.
- 11. It is the exhibitor's responsibility to be able to locate and present the identification.
- 12. Exhibitors are limited to not more than two entries per class.
- 13. All cattle must be tested for Bovine Viral Diarrhea Persistent Infection. See animal health regulations for additional information.
- 14. All hay and bedding must be furnished by the exhibitor.
- 15. All animals must be housed in places assigned by the dairy cattle superintendent.
- 16. Classes will be added for other recognized breeds, if necessary.

- 17. Judging and awards will be on the Danish system. 4-H judging is done on a Danish system of blue, red, and white ribbons. Based upon a given set of standards, projects may be awarded all blue ribbons if the judge feels that all entries are above the average for that group. The judge usually awards a combination of blue, red, and white ribbons (excellent = blue; average = red; below the standard = white). In addition, in animals versus vegetables or clothing, judging the blues, reds and whites are usually arranged in order (1<sup>st</sup> blue; 2<sup>nd</sup> blue; 1<sup>st</sup> red; 2<sup>nd</sup> red, etc.).
- 18. Exhibitors must show their own animals:
  - a. If an exhibitor has two entries in a class, the second entry must be shown by another youth who is also exhibiting in the show.
  - b. In emergency situations exceptions can be made, but arrangements must be cleared with the 4-H Dairy Advisory Committee.
  - c. Youth having a conflict with sports or work does not constitute an emergency situation. Youth with college and military commitments may apply to the 4-H Dairy Advisory Committee to have another youth show their animal. Requests to do so must be noted on entry form.
  - d. Exhibitors are encouraged to prepare their own cattle for show and should maintain the youth exhibit area. Adults should not be seen doing this work.
  - e. No coaching of exhibitors will be allowed from outside of the showring.
  - f. Code of ethics of the Purebred Dairy Cattle Association will be enforced.
- 19. Your entire exhibit must stay in place until 8 pm on Saturday, including all decorations and identification cards unless directed otherwise by the superintendent.

# Best Junior and Senior Owned & Bred

Exhibitors may show only one animal per class. Dam must be individually owned by exhibitor. Breeder and owner must match word for word.

#### **Junior Club Herd**

Three animals owned by three different exhibitors. Will be shown at the end of Junior Champion Class.

#### Senior Club Herd

Three animals (at least one animal must be over two years old) owned by three different exhibitors.

#### Junior and Senior Club Herds

Animals may participate in only the Junior Club Herd or the Senior Club Herd. Clubs are limited to one entry per class.

# **Championship Awards**

Ribbons for the Junior and Senior Champion and Reserve Champion and Grand Champion females of each breed will be presented. All first and second place animals with blue ribbons may compete for these ribbons.

The Junior Champion female of each breed will compete for Supreme Junior Champion of all Breeds.

The Grand Champion Female of each breed will compete for Grand Champion Female of all Breeds.

#### **MILK AUCTION**

On Saturday, at the 4-H Livestock Auction, one gallon of milk will be sold from the Grand Champion 4-H Dairy Animal. The gallon of milk will be taken from one of the subsequent milkings following the show and taken for processing. The youth exhibiting the animal, and the animal itself, must be present for the auction.

#### JERSEY SPECIALS

The Delaware County Jersey Cattle Club, Inc. will present awards to 4-H club members of Delaware County exhibiting Jersey cattle at the county fair as follows:

- 1. To a member who has never shown at the county fair before this year and who has not won first place in any of the regular classes.
- 2. To a member 8 to 12 years of age who has not won first place in any of the regular classes.
- 3. To a member 13 to 19 years of age who has not won first place in any of the regular classes.

The above awards will be based on the cooperation and sportsmanship demonstrated by the individual, as well as the quality of their exhibit during fair week. The winners of these awards will be selected by an appointed committee, who will be observing during the week.

These awards will be presented at the fall annual meeting of the Delaware County Jersey Cattle Club, Inc.
