Decorations should be original, have a pleasing appearance, and most of all, have the ability to catch and hold the attention of passers-by. They should also feature 4-H prominently throughout.

HORSE REGULATIONS

It is the responsibility of each exhibitor to know and follow the rules for the 4-H horse show and each class they have entered. See New York State Rule Book for class descriptions. Please obtain these rules early so you know your class routines.

4-H horse show is held Tuesday and Wednesday starting at 8 am during fair week.

JUNE 1 Deadline: -To be eligible to compete in the 4-H Horse Show, you MUST be an active 4-H member for the

current 4-H year. (Enrolled by the last business day of December of the current 4-H year.)
-Horses MUST be registered at Cornell Cooperative Extension, Hamden. (Horse Certificates

handed in to the Extension office by June 1 of the current 4-H year.)

-Required Paperwork: Horse Certificate,

4-H Animal Lease Agreement, if applicable,

Release for Participation form, Acknowledgement of Risk form,

Current Negative Coggins (2021 or 2022), and

Current Year Rabies Certificate

JULY 27 Deadline: -Entry forms MUST be at the Cornell Cooperative Extension, Hamden on or before July 27.

14 DAYS BEFORE FAIR: -Rabies vaccine MUST be administered at a minimum of 14 days prior to arrival on fairgrounds.

DAY of ARRIVAL at FAIR: -A copy of the negative Coggins form and proof of Rabies vaccine MUST accompany the animal

when entering the fairgrounds. Any horse stabled outside New York State MUST have a current

health certificate dated within 30 days of the show.

ENTRIES AND PREMIUMS

Riders may enter as many classes as they wish. Premiums will be paid for the top five placings. The 4-H Fair Superintendent reserves the right to refuse an entry in a class if the exhibitor is not adequately prepared for the class they are entering.

No entry fee is charged in this or any other section of Department L.

SAFETY REQUIREMENTS

It is Delaware County's 4-H policy that you wear your helmet and heeled boots anytime you are handling your horse. This includes in the stall. Helmets must be ASTM 1163-SEI. Riders must wear a boot with distinguishable heel. No lug sole boots.

HORSE STALLS

To request a 4-H horse stall, please complete the open show stall form. The open stall form fulfills both the open and 4-H stall requests.

4-Hers not staying for the open horse show will need to have their stalls cleaned and horses removed by 7 pm or one hour after the end of the 4-H horse show, whichever is earlier.

GENERAL RULES

Showmanship class is MANDATORY. Youth are required to enter showmanship for each division in order to be eligible for all day end championships. Inspection class is mandatory for Gymkhana.

No washing of horses inside the barn. Grooming of horses in the aisle area will be prohibited. No hay, straw, shavings or their bedding may be stored in the isle of the barn. 4-H programs stress safety. Any equipment left in a manner which is unsafe for horses, exhibitors, or spectators will be confiscated by the show management.

4-Hers must walk their horses when outside of the ring.

The horse must be shown by the 4-H member who is using the horse as a project during the current year. In case of death or incapacitation of the project horse after the registration date of June 1 of the current year, the 4-Her will be allowed to replace the project horse with another mount. The 4-Her will be required to present a veterinarian's certificate to Cornell Cooperative Extension, Hamden.

Horses under two years of age may be shown only in fitting and showmanship classes. No stallions of any age may be shown by 4-Hers or stabled in the 4-H barn during the 4-H horse show.

Show management reserves the right to combine, omit or divide a class if entries warrant. Classes with more than fifteen riders may be split.

4-Hers that show in classes requiring a canter or lope in the 4-H horse show will not jeopardize their open horse show walk-trot status.

Any horse left saddled in its stall should not be bridled, unless an attendant is present at all times. If the horse is to be left unattended and saddled, the horse should be haltered and tied, and the stirrups up, if possible.

Walk-Trot classes are open to all riders who have never shown their horse in a class where they are required to canter or lope. These exhibitors may only show in Walk-Trot and Driving classes during this show. 4-Hers riding in the Walk-Trot division must stay in that division throughout the entire 4-H horse show.

Class explanations have been drawn up after reference to the United States Equestrian Federation rules and New York State 4-H Horse Show rules. In some instances, these rules have been modified or more fully explained so that young people will gain maximum educational benefit from the showing experience. The 4-H Club Saddle Horse Project is basically a 4-H livestock project concerned with the training of young people. The horse is used as a medium for this training. The classes are prepared with the full knowledge of a wide variation in economic background of the 4-H club members concerned.

HORSE, PONY or MINIATURE

No same equine may be entered in both, horse, pony or miniature classes:

- -All miniature measurements will be standardized at 38 inches and under.
- -All pony measurements will be standardized at 14.2 hands (58") and under.
- -There is no minimum size for horses.

AGE

- -A child must have turned five by January 1 of the current 4-H year to be a Cloverbud.
- -A regular 4-H member must be 8 by January 1 of the current 4-H year and must not have reached their 19th birthday by January 1 of the current 4-H year.
- -Junior riders are to be 13 years of age or younger as of January 1 of the current 4-H year.
- -Senior riders are to be 14 years of age or older as of January 1 of the current 4-H year.
- -Cloverbuds are ages five through seven years of age as of January 1 of the current 4-H year.

CLOVERBUDS

Cloverbud classes are Leadline and Showmanship only and youth must be enrolled in a Cloverbud horse project. Cloverbud mounts must be registered with Cornell Cooperative Extension, Hamden by June 1. Cloverbuds will receive an incentive award and will receive a Cloverbud ribbon. Participants will not be placed. This is a participation class, not a competition class.

Cloverbud Classes

- -Showmanship: Adult (over 18) must be in ring while Cloverbud is showing. Cloverbuds will not be asked to trot their horses.
- -Cloverbud Leadline: Adult (over 18) must be leading horse. No driving, over fences or draft horses are allowed in the 4-H Cloverbud Program.
- -Stick Horse Gymkhana: Designed to help Cloverbuds learn Gymkhana patterns.
- -Stick Horse Pleasure: Designed to show Cloverbuds the three different gaits, proper direction, how to reverse in the ring, back up your horse and line up using a stick horse. Cloverbuds will need to bring their own stick horse.
- -Cloverbuds may ride in Walk-Trot or Walk-Jog classes when they have adequately demonstrated the 'on the ground' skills necessary to work safely with equines.

SHORT STIRRUP HUNTER CLASSES

Entries in the Short Stirrup Hunter classes may compete in any Flat class, and the Hunter Hack class at the junior or senior level. They must not be a Walk-Trot competitor. Short Stirrup Hunter shall be defined as those in their first or second year of riding Over Fences at the Canter.

GYMKHANA

- -No running into the arena.
- -Youth MUST dismount after run before exiting the arena.
- -Any horse not under control will be disqualified at the 4-H Horse Advisory Committee's discretion.
- -Gymkhana riders are required to enter the Inspection Class and will have their horse inspected by an evaluator on grooming, tack, and attire.
- -Day End Champion and Reserve Champion will be given for Junior and Senior for all Gymkhana Divisions.

STABLE MANAGEMENT AWARD

A special award will be given to the individual 4-Hers providing the best care and maintenance of their horse, tack and stable area. Sign up at the secretary's stand to get a stall card.
